Typically, fall term enrollments account for the greatest portion of annual enrollment. After enrollments declined after the 2002-03 year, FTES had leveled off as evidenced by the 2004-05 to 2006-07 fall and spring semesters. The 2007-08 year saw an increase of 4 to 5 percent.
