Typically, fall term enrollments account for the greatest portion of annual enrollment. After enrollments declined following the 2002-03 year, FTES had leveled off to the 2008-09 fall and spring semesters. The 2009-10 year had major increases in headcount and FTES in the fall and spring semesters, which continued into 2010-11. There have been major declines across the VCCS in the last two years.

Career Studies programs have increased with new program offerings in recent history. Certificate enrollments have dropped. After stabilizing, Unclassified enrollments declined, even with continued growth of dual enrollment students, though, with the decrease in enrollment, this percentage has risen again. A&S enrollments have had a general decline, though the switch between A&S and AAS students in 2012-13 is remarkable.
