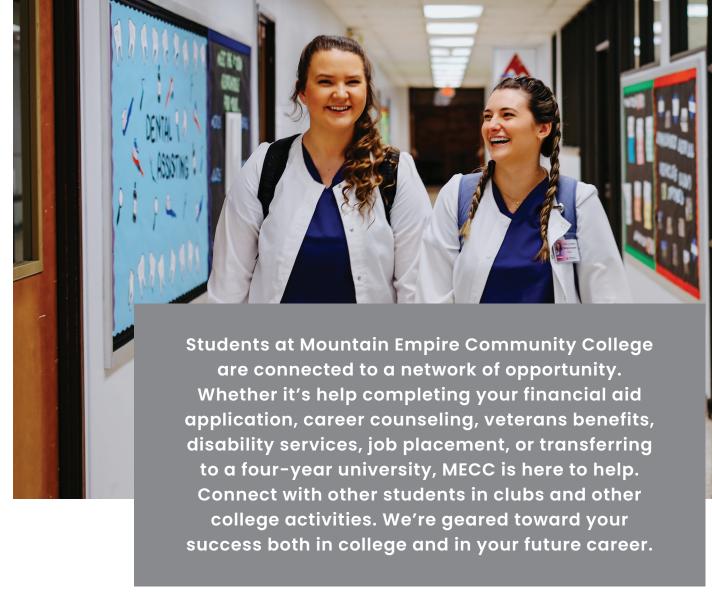

PRIOR LEARNING CREDIT


Students who are veterans or have qualifying past work experience may qualify for college credit through MECC's Prior Learning Credit option. Credit may be awarded for subject-matter competency based on previous college credit, military service, or through past work experience in a related field. Students may be required to complete an interview and test in order to receive credit. Students who believe they are eligible should contact their academic advisor before registering for classes.

PROMISE PROGRAM

Your future. Your opportunities.

The Mountain Empire Community College Foundation's Promise Program guarantees all high school graduates in our service region tuition-free community college.

The Promise Program is intended to help students who have plans to enroll in community college post high school, or those who go directly to employment.

To qualify, students must maintain a 2.0 GPA, be continuously enrolled up to two years or 72 credit hours up to completion of their first associate degree; provide proof of residency in Lee, Dickenson, Scott, or Wise county or the city of Norton; complete a FAFSA and submit required documentation annually; and complete the MECC Scholarship Application annually.



GREAT EXPECTATIONS

Fostering powerful change.

Great Expectations is part of a statewide initiative that serves current and former foster care youth. We provide resources, tools, information, and guidance to support our participants in reaching their educational and career goals. We also help them overcome day-to-day life stressors so they are able to transition into a healthy and successful adulthood.

Great Expectations is designed to help guide former foster youth through college. Some students need help with job applications or career choices. Others need more immediate support like housing and food. The GE Coordinator works with each student to identify their needs and to come up with a plan to meet those needs.

G3: GET A SKILL, GET A JOB, GET AHEAD

What is the G3 program?

The G3 Program is a tuition assistance program for any Virginia resident who qualifies for in-state tuition and whose family income falls below an identified threshold. Eligible students may enroll in designated programs leading to jobs in high-demand fields.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE G3 PROGRAM?

Any Virginia resident who:

- · Oualifies for in-state tuition
- Has a total household income of less than or equal to 400% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Is enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours in a Virginia community college
- Has applied for federal and/or state financial aid programs

HOW DOES G3 TUITION ASSISTANCE WORK?

G3 assistance makes up the difference between what federal or state financial aid pays for and the cost of tuition, fees, and books. This means if you enroll in a G3-eligible certificate or degree program, you must first complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

You may also be required to provide documentation of household income or eligibility for federal assistance. If you want to come to school and get certifications or a degree that leads to a career, we can find money to make it happen—through G3 or other funding.



APPLY FOR THE G3 PROGRAM

- 1 Select your career path.
- 2 Apply to MECC.
- **3** Fill out the FAFSA or FANTIC application.
- 4 Contact an advisor to plan classes and confirm financial aid.
- **5** Enroll in your first classes.

You do not have to apply for these funds separately. You will be identified based on the eligibility criteria and program of study and awarded funding automatically.

START YOUR FOUR-YEAR DEGREE HERE

Interested in a four-year degree? Start at MECC.

FINANCIAL AID

Full- and part-time students who are enrolled in a program of study at MECC may apply for financial aid to take credit classes. Audited classes are not eligible for financial aid.

DEADLINES TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID (FAFSA)

Although you can file the online FAFSA anytime, it is best to complete the FAFSA by the priority deadline of May 1st of the year that you plan to attend MECC. This ensures that you will receive consideration for all available aid that you might qualify for. You must complete the FAFSA at least two weeks prior to the first day of class of the first semester you attend. Financial aid may come in the form of grants, scholarships, or a work-study position (part-time job).
