Career Studies programs have increased with new program offerings in recent history. Certificate enrollments have dropped. After stabilizing, Unclassified enrollments declined, even with continued growth of dual enrollment students, though, with the decrease in enrollment, this percentage has risen again. A&S enrollments have had a general decline, though there has been a switch between A&S and AAS students in 2012-13 due to the effective elimination of "pre-health" programs, with those students largely being put into General Studies.
