STEP 1: APPLY FOR ADMISSION

To apply to attend MECC, you must complete the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) online application, https://apply.vccs.edu/oa/launch.action. After completing and submitting your application, you will receive a student ID number and username on your confirmation page. Print this page or write down this information for your records.

For noncredit class enrollment, visit the Workforce Solutions web page at www.mecc. edu/workforce.

STEP 2: APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

MECC encourages all eligible degree and certificate seeking students to apply for financial aid at fafsa.ed.gov. Financial aid may come in the form of grants, scholarships, loans and work-study positions. MECC's school code to include on the FAFSA form is 009629.

Deadlines to Apply for Financial Aid

Although you can file the online FAFSA anytime, it is best to complete the FAFSA prior to May 1 of the year that you plan to attend MECC. Please review MECC's financial aid web page at www.mecc.edu/paying-for-college for deadlines and more details about financial aid. You can also research available scholarships at www.mecc.edu/scholarships.

After completing STEP 2, continue with STEP 3 in the enrollment process.

STEP 3: TAKE PLACEMENT TESTS, SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS, AND MEET WITH AN ADVISOR

Take Placement Tests

Students who plan to apply for financial aid or pursue a degree or certificate at MECC requiring math or English courses must take placement tests. These tests are administered in the Testing Center located in the Student Services Suite in Holton Hall. There is no fee to take the placement tests. You can prepare for these tests by reviewing placement test information, located at www.mecc.edu/testing. Please see page 9 for more information.

Possible exemptions from taking some or all of the placement tests include:

- SAT scores (within two years) of at least 550 in Math and/or 560 in Reading/ Writing*
- Certain ACT scores (consult with MECC's Admissions Office)
- Successful completion of certain college-level Math and/or English courses
- AP test scores of 3 or higher in English and/or Math
- * These scores reflect policy changes as of March 2016. Students with SAT scores prior to March 2016, consult consult your advisor.



Send High School or College Transcripts to MECC

Students applying for admission should submit their high school or college transcript information to MECC's Enrollment Services Office, located in Godwin Hall, prior to registering for courses.

Meet with an Advisor

After taking your placement tests, make an appointment with an advisor. Additional information about advising options is included in this publication. After meeting with your advisor, continue with STEP 4 in the enrollment process.

Pay for Classes

Pay for classes either online through MECC Online, by using the TMS Payment Plan Option, or in person at the Business Office (Godwin Hall, 1st floor). To learn more about payment options, visit www.mecc.edu/paying-for-college. Important: You will be dropped from classes if you do not pay tuition and fees by the payment deadline noted in the Academic Calendar.

COMPLETING THE FAFSA

Paying for college can be a stressful and a complicated process. Mountain Empire Community College will help you complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) during one of our free financial aid workshops. You do not have to attend MECC to participate.

Everyone should complete a FAFSA regardless of your financial situation. The FAFSA is a government application for education aid and is one of the first steps to finding resources to pay for college. The FAFSA is used to determine your eligibility for free federal aid.

Students must reapply for federal student aid each academic year.



Take the following steps to get it done:

- 1. Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1.
 - a. Find the application at fafsa.ed.gov.
 - b. Be sure to check out important information on deadline dates at fafsa.ed.gov/deadlines.htm.
 - c. Apply for a FSA ID at the same website so you can sign your application electronically. Store your FSA ID in a secured location. You will need it to reapply for financial aid each year.
- 2. Find out how much aid you are qualified to receive.
 - a. A few weeks after completing the FAFSA, you'll receive your Student Aid Report from the Department of Education. This report includes your Expected Family Contribution (how much the government believes you and your family should contribute toward your education).
 - b. Next you'll receive award letters from the schools in which you have applied. The award letter outlines how much financial aid you are eligible to receive, including grants, scholarships, workstudy programs, and federal loans.
 - c. Remember, you don't have to accept all the aid you are offered in your award letter.

Information you need to complete the FAFSA

DEPENDENT STUDENTS

Students are typically considered dependent if they are 23 years of age or younger, have no children or other dependents, are not married and have not served in the armed forces.

You must bring the following for both you and your parents.

- Federal Tax Return (including W-2)
- Untaxed Income
- Social Security Numbers
- Dates of Birth
- Information on savings, investments, business and farm assets
- PIN Numbers


INDEPENDENT STUDENTS

Students are typically considered independent if they are 24 yours of age or older, are married, have children and/or other dependents, have served or are presently in the armed forces. Students whose parents are both deceased, or who have been in foster care, a ward of the court, or under legal guardianship, may also qualify for independent status.

You must bring the following for both you and your spouse.

- Federal Tax Return (including W-2)
- Untaxed Income
- Social Security Numbers
- Dates of Birth
- Information on savings, investments, business and farm assets
- PIN Number

FINANCIAL AID TERMS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Award Letter

An offer from a college or career school that states the type and amount of financial aid the school is willing to provide if you accept admission and register to take classes at that school. MECC sends financial aid award letters via email to your VCCS student email account.

Award Year

The academic year for which a financial aid award is used to fund a student's education. MECC's academic year is summer through spring.

Cost of Attendance (COA)

The total amount it will cost you to go to school—usually stated as a yearly figure.

Dependent Student

A student who does not meet any of the criteria for an independent student.

Enrollment Status

Reported by the school the student attended, indicates whether the student is (or was) full-time, three-quarter time, half-time, less than half-time, withdrawn, graduated, etc.

Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

This is the number that is used to determine your eligibility for federal student financial aid.

FAFSA

The FREE application used to apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, loans, and workstudy.

Federal School Code

An identifier that the U.S. Department of Education assigns to each college or career school that participates in the federal student aid programs. MECC's Federal School Code is 009629.

Financial Need

The difference between the cost of attendance (COA) at a school and your Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

FSAID

The FSA ID is a username and password combination that serves as a student's or parent's identifier to allow access to personal information in various U.S. Department of Education systems and acts as a digital signature on some online forms. For additional information on setting up a FSA ID visit fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm.

Independent Student

An independent student is one of the following: at least 24 years old, married, a graduate or professional student, a veteran, a member of the armed forces, an orphan, a ward of the court, or someone with legal dependents other than a spouse, an emancipated minor or someone who is homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU)

The amount of all Federal Pell Grant aid (in percentage) awarded to you divided by the amount of Pell Grant aid you would have been eligible to receive based on full-time enrollment. The amount of Federal Pell Grant funds a student may receive over his or her lifetime is limited by federal law to be the equivalent of six years of Pell Grant funding.

Net Price Calculator

A tool that allows current and prospective students, families, and other consumers to estimate the net price of attending a particular college or career school. The Virginia Community College Net Price Calculator can be accessed at www.vawizard.org/vccs/FinAidCostCompare.action.

Verification

The process your school uses to confirm that the data reported on your FAFSA is accurate. Your school has the authority to contact you for documentation that supports income and other information you reported.

Work-Study

A federal student aid program that provides part-time employment while you are enrolled in school to help pay your education expenses.

COMPARING AWARD LETTERS

If you haven't already decided on a school, receiving your award letters will probably help you make your decision. For many students, school choice comes down to the financial aid package.

Scholarships arships

Mountain Empire Community College receives donor support and grants which fund a variety of scholarships, the majority of which are provided through the Mountain Empire Community College Foundation. The MECC Foundation is an institutionally-related 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable foundation whose mission is to foster the growth and progress of Mountain Empire Community College. The MECC Foundation awards scholarships from over 160 funds.

AIMS Higher Scholarship

The MECC AIMS Higher Scholarship encourages Virginia-resident high school students in Lee, Scott, Wise, Dickenson Counties and the City of Norton to complete a challenging curriculum and to pursue higher education. Graduating high school students who meet the requirements of the AIMS Scholars (Virginia Scholars) program will have the opportunity to attend up to two years (72 semester credits) of college without paying any tuition or fees out of pocket. How to Apply

Applications for MECC Foundation scholarships, AIMS Higher, and Virginia Tobacco Scholarships are submitted online at www.mecc.edu/scholarships. To apply for scholarships, use your MECC Online Username and password. The deadline to apply for MECC Foundation scholarships is July 31.



PLACEMENT TESTING AN ADVISING VISING

The VPT is used by all colleges within the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) to determine if you are ready for college-level courses. This test places students in English and Math courses that match their abilities and allows them to develop the skills necessary for optimal performance in all courses. Your placement results will determine which courses you are eligible to take in reading, writing, and math skills.

Placement testing is administered any time between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m., Monday through Friday. Appointments are not necessary for placement testing. To ensure adequate time for testing, please arrive no later than 10 a.m. Students and prospective students should call 276.523.7472 to confirm the Testing Center hours of operation for academic & placement testing.

ACADEMIC-RELATED TESTING

Academic-related testing, such as video, web, makeup tests and other course or program assessments (except for Placement Tests), are administered any time the office is open, from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. on Fridays. Please arrive to the Testing Center within enough time to complete the test. Students enrolled in distance education classes at other VCCS institutions may make arrangements for proctored testing.

Academic advisors assist students in selecting proper courses as related to their declared program, interpreting curriculum requirements, and assessing academic progress. Academic advisors are familiar with the college and with the programs for which they advise. They can either answer questions directly, or direct students to the appropriate campus resource.

Specifically, your academic advisor can help you by providing:

- Academic planning assistance and guidance for course selection for upcoming semesters.
- Advice and planning during times of academic difficulty.
- Referrals to college or community resources.

You should visit with an academic advisor when you:

- Are a new student or a student returning after an absence of several years.
- Need placement test results interpreted.
- Want to talk about courses, review your academic plan, or discuss graduation requirements.
- Need to discuss courses for the upcoming semester.

Visit either Student Services Office or Center for Outreach & Success when you:

- Are non-degree seeking and want to discuss courses for the upcoming semester.
- Are having academic difficulties.
- Need help locating someone to talk to about community resources.
- Have questions about changing or adding additional programs.
- Have questions about transferring.

NEW STUDENT CHECKLIST

Now that you have completed the Steps to Enrollment, here are a few other things that you need to be ready for college.

- Get a student photo ID. All MECC students must register for a student ID. You can obtain your student ID at the Center for Student Outreach & Success in Holton Hall.
- Buy or rent your books. First, check your class syllabus to determine what books are required (find the syllabus in Blackboard). You can also visit the MECC Bookstore at www.mecc.edu/bookstore. Click the link for books and then click the dropdown for textbooks and course materials. Enter the specific course information and find the link to the ISBN number for the text. The MECC Bookstore is located on campus in Holton Hall and is open Monday Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. You can use your financial aid funds to pay for textbooks and required supplies only during certain dates each semester.
- Access your MECC email. You will receive official MECC announcements about financial aid and other updates through your MECC email. Set up your email through MECC Online. After logging in with your username and password, select the "Gmail" link.
- Access your class schedule. Your class schedule is considered your official list of credit classes for which you registered. Access your schedule through MECC Online, and you'll see all the classes for which you registered. Credit classes show up in Blackboard either on the first day of the class or within 48 hours after registering. On the first day of class, be sure to have a printed or online copy of your class schedule handy so you'll know the date, time, building and room number of your classes. The letter which precedes the room number designates the building in which your class is held: G=Godwin Hall, H=Holton Hall, D=Dalton-Cantrell Hall, P=Phillips-Taylor Hall, R=Robb Hall.
- Get a free parking decal. All MECC students must register for a parking permit. Register for your parking permit at the Business Office located on the first floor of Godwin Hall.

✓ Attend the New Student Seminar. All new students are required to attend the New Student Seminar, a comprehensive SDV course which is scheduled prior to the first day of classes during the semester's Welcome Week activities. New Student Seminar meets the requirements of SDV 100. It is taught in two days, culminating in a day of activities that will provide students opportunities to engage with their specific program faculty and interact with student clubs and organizations. Completion of the two-day class provides an opportunity for new students to begin classes more prepared for their college experience and allows them the opportunity to make connections with their fellow students and college personnel. Visit the library. MECC's Wampler library is located on the second floor of Robb Hall. Visit the library to access material and research needed for your courses. A valid student ID is required to access these resources. Library resources are available online at www.mecc.edu/library.

Sign up to receive MECC alerts. For your safety and convenience, we strongly recommend that you sign up for our emergency alert system. The system will notify you quickly with an email and text about MECC closings due to inclement weather or about emergency situations. To register for alerts, visit www.mecc.edu/textalerts.






